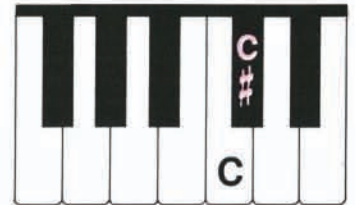


NOTE: The quarter notes may be played a bit unevenly, to give a “Boogie lilt” to the rhythm:
